The agricultural growth rate in Maharashtra is a

dismal minus 16 per cent.
However, with good
monsoon and various
schemes being implemented by the Maharashtra government for the last two years, area under rabi crop is going to increase that may lift agricultural sector from morass and further take agricultural growth rate to 8-10 per cent, said chief minister Devendra Fadnavis here on Friday.

He was speaking during the inauguration of 4-day Agro Vision Expo at sprawling Reshimbagh ground. Union transport and shipping minister, Nitin Gadkari presided over the programme.

Chief minister on this occasion further stressed the need of increasing productivity of the land by minimising production cost.

Due to low productivity and high cost of produc-tion, the remunerative prices for agricultural produce can not become profTo improve productivity, about 50,000 acre land is being brought under organic cultivation, he fur-

organic cultivation, he fur-ther said.

The concept of Zero Budgeting is taking roots in Mahrashtra which has resulted into low produc-tion cost and high produc-tion. Farming should be done in a scientific manner he said and added that experimentation increase area under agriculture. In

Vidarbha Marathwada solar energy would be utilised for operating agricultural pumps even as more power is being supplied to agricul-

being supplied to agricul-tural pump sets, he said.

Coupled with this, cre-ation of 1 lakh wells and farm ponds and the proj-ects like Jalyukta Shivar would increase the unde-ground water table, he informed.

Nitin Gadkari said the objective of holding the expo year after year is to stem farmers' suicide in Vidarbha and increase their income by taking lat-est technology to the

est technology to the doorstep of farmers.

He said Agrovision office would be started on a permanent basis in Nagpur. The office would function all round the year and provide expert guidance to the ryots of the region. He also appealed to the State government to provide maximum benefit of drip irrigation to the farmers and take efforts for ushering in milk revolution in Vidarbha and Marathwada - like that in Gujarat.
